Presidents Day

Presidents' Day is an American holiday celebrated on the third Monday in February. Originally established in 1885 in recognition of President George

Washington, it is still officially called "Washington's Birthday" by the federal government. Traditionally celebrated on February 22 - Washington's actual day of birth - the holiday became popularly known as Presidents' Day after it was moved as part of 1971's Uniform Monday Holiday Act, an attempt to create more three-day weekends for the nation's workers.

While several states still have individual holidays honoring the birthdays of Washington, Abraham Lincoln, and other figures, Presidents' Day is now popularly viewed as a day to celebrate all U.S. presidents past and present.

Punxsutawney Phil To Appear On February 2 - Groundhog Day Facts and Trivia

- ♦ Groundhog day falls on February 2nd every year and is an 'observance', not a public holiday.
- ♦ Groundhog day centers on the groundhog coming out of its home to 'predict' the weather.
- ♦ Traditionally, if the groundhog sees its shadow, it indicates six more weeks of winter. If it does not see its shadow, then spring is on its way.



- ♦ The official groundhog, Punxsutawney Phil, lives in Gobbler's Knob near Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania.
- Groundhog day was first observed in the U.S. in the 1800s when German immigrants settled in Pennsylvania. The groundhog was substituted for the badger as there were not many badgers in Pennsylvania at that time.
