IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following criteria shall apply in scheduling hearings and review in juvenile dependency matters:

A	Date child removed from home or voluntarily placed with the tribe.		File petition (B) For good cause, the court may order C & D hearings continued; if so use the actual date of the hearing.
B	Shelter Hearing: A + maximum of 5 judicial days		
C	Shelter Review Hearing: B + maximum of 10 judicial days		
D	Discovery: Due date for all parties to make discovery: C + 7 judicial days		
E	Admission/Denial Hearing: B + 30 days No later than 30 days from petition file date each person about whom allegations have been made shall admit or deny the allegations.		
F	Jurisdiction/Disposition Hearing: B + 60 days This hearing shall occur within 60 days of the first Shelter Hearing (B).
