
Housing Payment Pick Up

# Kilkich Community Garden Beds



As a gardener, you will need to plant, weed, fertilize, and harvest your bed as needed. There is no charge to use the community garden, but your bed MUST be maintained. This requires a weekly personal commitment of time and energy.

WATER - The garden is on an automatic, timed, watering system, so you will not need to water your garden bed.

CROPS - Cool weather crops generally perform well in our coastal climate. Past success has been seen with artichokes, beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, chives, kale, kohlrabi, leeks, lettuce, onions, peas, potatoes, spinach, squash, and turnips, just to name a few.

The garden has a perimeter fence to deter deer; slugs are usually your most obnoxious and destructive pests. Pets are not allowed in the garden area.

If you are interested in a garden bed this year or have a question about the garden, call the CIHA office at 541-888-6501. Again, the beds will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

# Chinuk WaWa - Yes, They Have An App For That!

Last August, the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde introduced a smart-phone computer application (or "app") for learning Chinuk WaWa (aka Chinook Jargon).

Titled Chinuk Wawa, the app is available on iOS operating systems (iPhone, iPad, and iPod Touch). The app is in development for Android operating systems and is currently not available.

Created by the Grand Ronde's Lands and Culture
Department, the Chinuk Wawa language app includes language lessons, practice games, and quizzes in fundamental categories like food, family, colors, and numbers. There is also a culture section with historic photos, histories of the tribes in Grande Ronde and stories written in Chinuk Wawa with English translations.

If you want to learn the trade language that ancestors of today's Coquille Indian Tribe used when speaking to people who did not know how to speak Miluk, Hanis, or Upper Coquille Athabaskan, then type "Chinuk Wawa" on your Apple device's App Store search tool and get started!

This language program is not the only way you can pick up some Chinuk Wawa. There are several books on the subject at the CIT Library and the Grand Ronde sponsors classes and workshops that are open to the public on a regular basis. Some of these classes are held at Portland Community College, other classes are held in the Grand Ronde's community.

There are several web pages with free information on this trade language. One is Chaku-Kəmdəks Chinuk Wawa www.learnchinookjargon. wordpress.com, a blog site run by Eric Bernando, a Grand Ronde Tribal member and language teacher. Visit the CIT Library's web page at

and you will find several links to other online Chinuk Wawa resources.

In Chinuk-WaWa, capital letters are sometimes found in the middle or at the end of words. Exact pronunciations are sometimes difficult to duplicate with the English alphabet.

**QHata Nayka**: How are you?

**Lush nayka**: I am good

**LaXayfN nayka shiks**: Hello my friend

Nayka qat mayka: I love you

Salt-tsfqw: Ocean or saltwater

Taqwfla: Hazelnuts, or nuts of

any kind

**PHaya-TsikTsik**: Automobile (literally, fire wagon)

*TilixaN*: People, friend or family
