2014 Kilkich Resident Holiday Credits Awarded

The CIHA Board of Commissioners has once again approved a holiday credit to be awarded to each household on Coquille Tribal Lands. The holiday credit will be shown on your December 2014 billing statement. The credit amount ranges from \$25 to \$150. Holiday credits are awarded based on how well each household complied with their housing agreement during the fiscal year.

Compliance categories remain the same as in previous years, and are:

- Payments (made on time and in full each month without fail)
- Inspections (no home damage beyond normal wear and tear; no housekeeping issues)
- Update Information (provided timely, voluntarily, and/or upon request)
- Neighbor
 Complaints
 (no actionable complaints on file)

If you did not receive the maximum \$150 credit, you have an opportunity to earn the highest credit during the next 11 months. Beginning this month, pay your rent on time, do not damage your unit, submit required paperwork by the date it is due, and avoid neighborhood complaints by being a good neighbor.

Please remember that

PETS are NOT allowed on Tribal Lands in rental units.

If you have a prescription for a companion animal, the animal must be spayed or neutered and up-to-date on vaccinations - no exceptions.

You are required to submit current vaccination records and proof of spay or neuter to the CIHA office. Companion animals must be approved by CIHA BEFORE being added to your household. S/Nipped offers low-cost spay and neuter services. Contact S/Nipped at 541-808-2377.

Library Preparing for Move, and Other Items of Interest

Books Transferred From the Main Office With the new building for CELS getting closer to completion, the Library is preparing for the move by consolidating the Tribe's book collections. The book resources kept at the Tribe's main office, including resources used by the Tribe's Cultural Resources Program, and some materials donated to the Tribe, are being moved to the Education Center and Library, and are in the process of being added to the book collection. Many of these books focus on a subject specific to Native Americans (a specific tribe, federal laws affecting tribes, indigenous languages, etc.). Some of the new additions, much like the CIT Library's holdings, cover "non-Indian" specific subjects. Many of these are still of interest to members of the Coquille Indian Tribe community. As these new materials are added to the Library's collection, they will be made available to all CIT Library patrons. Please stop by the library and take a look at the book collection.


