#### 2017 Annual Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing

If you rent a single-family home in the Kilkich community and are NOT living in a unit that has had a front yard makeover in the past, you are eligible to enter the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing.

- There is no cost to enter the drawing.
- One entry per household.
- The winner will be chosen by random drawing at the June 15<sup>th</sup> CIHA Board meeting.
- The prize is valued at up to \$2 per square foot.
- To be eligible, the renter agrees to perform required maintenance upon new landscape installation in accordance with Section 6(K) of their Rental Lease Agreement.

The winner will take part in the design of their new front yard with a focus on easy maintenance, a low-water landscape, and the incorporation of indigenous plants and materials.

The winner will NOT:

- Be eligible to participate in the next two CIHA Landscaping Contests held each year in June.
- Be eligible to enter the Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing again for the duration of their tenancy at their current address.

The winner will be notified by telephone or mail and an announcement will be published in the July Sea~Ha Runner.

Entry forms are available at the CIHA office; the entry forms are due no later than June 15<sup>th</sup> by 1:00 p.m.

# Drenched in "Spring" weather

The ongoing storms and other irregular weather might be changing up the local growing season, but dedicated gardeners are still going to be outside and working their plots of soil.

Remember, the CIT Library maintains a small collection of gardening books. These titles focus on providing advice for gardening in the Pacific Northwest and information on growing native plant species.

These titles include: 200 Tips for Growing Flowers in the Pacific Northwest, Propagation of Pacific Northwest Native Plants, 100 Best Plants for the Coastal Garden, Handbook of Northwest Gardening, and Growing Vegetables West of the Cascades.

#### Ever thought of joining a garden club or taking a class?

Oregon State University's local extensive service offers many individual classes on specific gardening topics as part of their Master Gardener certification program. Visit their web site at <a href="mailto:extension.oregonstate.edu/coos/coos-county-master-gardeners-program">extension.oregonstate.edu/coos/coos-county-master-gardeners-program</a> to learn more. There you will find an archive of *Garden Thymes*, a gardening newsletter, links to online articles, and information on how to become a certified Master Gardener.

For more informal advice, visit <u>extension.oregonstate.edu/gardening</u> to view many free growing guides, a monthly planning calendar, gardening tips (April is the time to pay attention to blackberries!), and advice on pest monitoring and management.

#### South Coast Community Garden Association (SCCGA)

The SCCGA represents gardening communities in Coos County and is dedicated to educating local communities on gardening and providing and managing a place for community members to grow produce and plants for personal use.



Their web site, <a href="https://socoastcommunitygardens.org">https://socoastcommunitygardens.org</a>, connects you to information and applications to community garden programs in Bandon, Lakeside, Coos Bay, Coquille, and Myrtle Point. It costs \$10 to rent a plot plus \$10 more to join the SCCGA.

You not only get a 10' x 12' gardening bed, you receive some seeds, top soil and other basics to get started. You will also have opportunities throughout the growing season to learn from Master Gardener volunteers who can provide on-site mentoring while also sponsoring education programs covering winter gardening, composting, seed starting, pruning, and vegetable gardening.

#### CIHA's Annual Landscaping Contest in June

CIHA will hold its annual landscaping contest again this year in June.

The criteria will be the same as it has been in past years.

Both homeowners and renters will be judged individually. Within the homeowner and renter categories, the front yard and back yard will be judged separately.

Yard judging is scheduled to take place mid-June and the local Master Gardeners will once again be the judges for the landscaping contest.

The judges will stop at each home (unless you have previously notified CIHA that you do not want your yard judged), take notes, perhaps some digital photos, and then collaboratively compare, tally, and decide upon the winners.

Prizes are as follows:

First prize = \$100 gift card
Second prize = \$75 gift card
Third prize = \$50 gift card
Honorable Mention = \$25
gift card

There is no entry fee to pay or sign-up sheet to complete to enter the contest; your yard will automatically be entered in the contest and judged unless you contact the CIHA office at 541-888-6501 by Friday, June 9<sup>th</sup> to opt out.

You do not have to be a skilled gardener to be a winner in this contest and everyone is encouraged to participate.

When judging the yards, the Master Gardeners look for a variety of elements, such as:

- Native Plants

- \* Color
- \* Bird Friendly
