Library Receives Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) Funding for Basic Library Services

The library recently received notification from the IMLS (Institute of Museum and Library Services) that it will receive funding awards from their Basic Library Services program for the next three vears. The awards total \$18,000 and will be dispersed annually in the amount of \$6,000.

The Tribe has applied for and received IMLS funding awards for nearly twenty years. The funding has been used by the library to purchase new and/ or updated equipment and materials for use by the library and its patrons.

IMLS funds have been used to purchase multiple copies of books focused on the Coquille and other Oregon tribes, including the 2nd edition of First Oregonians, The People are Dancing Again, a history of

the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, Living in the Great Circle: The Grande Ronde Indian Reservation 1855-1905. and Seeking Recognition: The Termination and Restoration of the Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians, 1855-1984.

Other books purchased with IMLS funds directly connected to the Coquille and southwest Oregon history includes the biographies: She's Tricky Like Coyote: Annie Miner Peterson, an Oregon Coast Indian Woman and Coquelle Thompson Athabaskan Witness: A Cultural Biography. Thesis works (I've read them and they are interesting and informative) include: Coos and the Coquille by Mark Tveskov; Coquille/Kokwel: A Southern Oregon Coast Indian Tribe by Jason Younker; and Growing up

Indian, an Emic Perspective by George Wasson. Other materials include South Slough Adventures: Life on a Southern Oregon Estuary; People of the Coquille Estuary by Roberta Hall; and the three published volumes of Changing Landscapes series, each containing numerous essays discussing tradition and history of the Coquille Indian Tribe and related subjects.
