CIT Library has IMLS Funding for Purchase of Books and Other Library Materials



Grant awards are used to purchase new equipment and materials (yes BOOKS!) for the Tribe's Library. The current award provides \$6,000 annually until 2015.

The annual grant funding the Tribe's Library uses to purchase new materials and update Library equipment renews for its 2nd year on July 1st. This makes for a perfect opportunity to remind members of the Tribe's community of the availability of the Library and its resources. Suggestions from community members on items to add to the collection are always welcome.

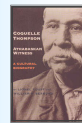
IMLS funds have been used to purchase multiple copies of books that focus on the Coquille and other Oregon tribes including the 2nd edition of First Oregonians: The People are Dancing Again: A History of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians: Living in the Great Circle: The Grande Ronde Indian Reservation 1855-1905; and Seeking Recognition: The Termination and Restoration of the Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians, 1855-1984.

The collection also includes multiple copies of The Coos and the Coquille by Mark Tveskov; Coquille/Ko-kwel: A Southern Oregon Coast Indian Tribe by Jason Younker; and Growing up Indian, an Emic Perspective by George Wasson.

Other books in the Library connected to the Coquille and southwest Oregon history include the biographies She's Tricky Like Coyote: Annie Miner Peterson, an Oregon Coast Indian Woman, and Coquelle Thompson.



Athabaskan Witness: A Cultural Biography. Other items of interest include South Slough Adventures, People of the Coquille Estuary by Roberta Hall and the three published volumes of the Changing Landscapes series, each containing numerous essays discussing the tradition and history of the Coquille Indian Tribe and related subjects.



IMLS funds have also been used to purchase computer equipment and accessories, including a color

printer. These are available for use by Library patrons. Visitors have used this equipment for, amongst other things, searching for jobs, registering for college classes, completing homework assignments, and conducting personal business.

While many of the Library's books focus on southwest Oregon, other subjects of importance to Native Americans are covered here too. These include health, education, finances, sovereignty, legal issues of concern to tribes, and language materials including Chinook Jargon, Spanish, American Sign Language, Miluk and Athabaskan.

The CIT Library is part of the Education Center and Library and is located on the Tribe's Reservation at 2611 Mexeye Loop.

With only a month left before school starts, families are planning their last camping trips for the summer.

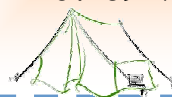
Coos County has a number of lovely parks to camp in, some with full amenities, some with limited amenities and some for day-use only.
