Low-Income Energy Assistance Program

September 23rd was the first day of fall, and it has already begun to feel like it; the days are shorter and the nights are cooler.

During this time of year, the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program, also know as LIEAP, generally becomes available to help low-income households with their home heating costs. This program is federally funded through the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services

(LIEAP)

and is not an entitlement program. Federal funding for the 2012 Low-Income Energy Assistance Program is likely, but not guaranteed.

To be eligible, a house-hold's income must be at or below 60 percent of Oregon's median income. The household must also have documented energy costs. Both homeowner and renter households are eligible.

CIHA will be notified when funding will be available. Notification will be sent out in the Sea~Ha Runner. Last year, funding became available at the end of November.


