Charleston Sanitary District Rate Hike



The Coquille Indian Housing Authority received notice on June 30, 2014 that the Charleston Sanitary District sewer rates will increase from the current monthly rate of \$57 to a new monthly rate of \$68 beginning on August 1, 2014.

The Charleston Sanitary District states the rate increase is due to the repair and rehabilitation of Wastewater Treatment Plant #2, antiquat- share of the cost of ed and deteriorating infrastructure, as well as the increasing costs for the treatment of sewage.

The existing infrastructure is a pollution under DEQ order to upgrade the existing the sewer pipes are old and leaky, and the Wastewater Treatment Plant is antiquated.

The Charleston Sanitary District will continue to raise sewer rates on an annual basis in order to generate sufficient funds to pay for the District's ongoing repairs to the infrastructure, the Wastewater Treatment Plant, and the treatment of sewage.

A ground-breaking ceremony was held in mid-June. The department expects to be operating in the new office by the end of the year. Currently, the Education Center and Library are still located at 2611 Mexeye Loop.


The CIT Library has many valuable resources available. Below are summaries of recently acquired books; some new, and some copies of popular existing titles.

Great Speeches by Native Americans. As the title strongly suggests, this book is a collection of speeches made by Native American



leaders. There are 82 speeches included in this collection spanning over 500 years of contact between indigenous Americans and various non-tribal groups. These speeches include refusal by Acuera, a leader of the Timucua of Florida, to meet with Spanish Conquistador Hernando De Soto in 1539, as well as a speech given by Russell Means to the United Nations Commission on Human Rights in 1977.

This book was written by Dick and Judy Wagner with contributions from the Coos Historical and Maritime



Museum. It is one of a series of local history books, each book focusing on a different city or community in Coos County. Similar books in the CIT Library cover Coos Bay, Bandon, and Port Orford (yes, that city is not in Coos County). The books include historical photos and essays covering the city's history beginning with the first pioneer settlements in North Bend and ending with information on the city today. While the focus is on the city itself, these books do not ignore the indigenous peoples of Coos County, including the Coos and Coquille and their contributions to the community from helping out the first settlers to contributing to the economy and overall culture of the community today.

She's Tricky Like Coyote. OK, this is not the first time I've talked about this Lionel Youst written biography of a famous Coos County woman.

Annie Miner Peterson was a Coos woman whose work with researchers, including John P. Harrington and Melville Jacobs, contributed greatly to the


has today about the Miluk and Hanis languages, stories, and other traditional practices of southwest Oregon tribes. The

Witness. Both are great resources of information on early, southwest Oregon history from the perspective of



Coos and Coquille ancestors, both before and after contact with pioneers and settlers.


