What are the Dangers of Secondhand Smoke? 🦷

Every time someone smokes, poisons are released into the air from the burning end of the cigarette, cigar, or pipe, and from exhaled smoke. Tobacco smoke is a group A carcinogen, which means it is proven to cause cancer in humans.

Each year, many non-smokers die from lung cancer as a result of breathing secondhand smoke. In addition to lung cancer, secondhand smoke can cause heart disease, asthma symptoms and attacks, cervical cancer, increased menstrual pain, low birth weight in newborns, nausea, and hoarseness. Children exposed to secondhand smoke are more likely to get sick. Illnesses they may have because of the smoke are asthma and frequent upper respiratory infections, such as colds and ear infections. Exposure to cigarette smoke may be a factor in SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome).

If you are regularly around someone who smokes at least a few cigarettes a day, your risks of medical problems are similar to the increased risks for smokers. A non-smoker in a very smoky room for one hour with several smokers inhales as many bad chemicals as someone who has actually smoked 10 or more cigarettes. There is no safe level of tobacco smoke. Being in a car with a smoker is especially bad, even with the windows open. It is now against the law to smoke in a car with children under the age of 18.

If you choose to smoke make sure and think about



children and pets who live with you or are nearby. They can't choose to get away from the smoke. You are making a life-long impact on their health.

Tribal Lands Fireworks Ordinance and happy

Please remember as you celebrate this 4th of July, that while fireworks are fun and exciting, they can be a fire and safety hazard if not handled properly.

- Coquille Tribal Ordinance 650.620 states that "a person commits a fireworks violation if the person sells or uses fireworks within the lands of the Tribe, except as hereby provided:
- Only those fireworks allowed by the State of Oregon are approved for use on Tribal Lands.

- Fireworks may only be ignited during the 48 hours before the official holiday and for 24 hours after.
- Official holidays during which fireworks may be ignited are the 4th of July and New Years Day.
- 4. Any person under the age of eighteen must have the immediate supervision of an adult.
- 5. Improper or unsafe use will result in the confiscation of all fireworks in the possession of the person by Tribal Police.

- Tribal officials may make subsequent restrictions on the use of fireworks based on public safety, weather conditions, and fire concerns.
- In addition, and not in lieu of any other penalty allowed by law, a \$50 assessment shall be paid to the Coquille Indian Housing Authority by any person found in violation of this ordinance."





Mill Casino - Hotel Annual Fireworks Display on July 3 at Dusk


