artificial trees if they are in good condition.

Please remove ALL decorations and the tree stand from the Christmas tree and set the tree out beside the curb at the end of your driveway.

Les' Recycling Changes Begin Immediately

Due to the changing global recycling market, only the following items will be accepted as 'recyclables'. ALL other items will be considered contamination and unacceptable and will need to be disposed of properly. DO NOT put unacceptable items in the community recycling dumpster.

The new rules are effective immediately.
ONLY the following items are allowed in the recycling dumpster.

- Brown corrugated cardboard - <u>flattened</u>
- Plastics #1 and #2
 <u>BOTTLENECK only.</u>
 No lids, yogurt,
 butter, cottage
 cheese, salad, etc.
 containers
- Magazines

- Newspapers clean
- White copy paper -<u>NO colored paper</u>, junk mail, envelopes
- Metal cans empty and rinse all cans;
 NO lids or food residue

Parking on Lawn Prohibited

Just a reminder that per CIHA's Common Scheme Restriction Policy,

"All parking, other than in the driveway or garage, must be on the side of the street where the streetlights are and must NOT exceed 24 hours." Also, "No tent structure, camper, recreational vehicle, motorcycle, trail bike, snowmobile, boat, trailer, motor coach, or

mobile home, or any structure of any kind shall be parked, placed, erected, or used upon the property."

If you receive a notice for parking in your yard, it will count against your holiday credit.

Would You Like to Earn the Maximum Holiday Credit in 2018?

In 2017, as in previous years, the CIHA Board of Commissioners approved a December holiday credit to be awarded to each household on Tribal Lands. The credit ranged from \$25 to \$150.

Would you like to earn the maximum holiday credit in 2018?

The holiday credit criteria are as follows:

- 1. Make your payment on time and in full each month
- 2. Pass your annual inspection
- 3. Return all CIHA paperwork on time and in full
- 4. Have no actionable neighborhood complaints

- 5. Have no power, water, or garbage shutoff notices
- 6. Have no yard or other violation notices

Marijuana is Illegal on Tribal Lands

Possession or use of marijuana for any purpose is prohibited within the Tribe's reservation lands. facilities, and housing as a matter of federal law.

Even though the State of Oregon allows the legal possession and consumption of marijuana, Oregon's law does not change federal drug laws, and those are the laws that

apply to CIHA housing. Marijuana remains classified as a Schedule I federal funding drug under the federal **Controlled Substances** Act and thus subject to federal prosecution. Because Tribal

reservation lands are federal trust lands and are subject to some federal jurisdiction, the possession or use of marijuana is unlawful. If CIHA were to allow marijuana possession

or use in its properties, CIHA's could be jeopardized.

If you possess or use ANY federally controlled substance. including marijuana, in CIHA housing, you will be subject to eviction.

Fire Safety Tips Using Extension Cords

Extension cords are wonderful tools, but they can be hazardous if used improperly. Listed below are some safety suggestions, as well as a few electrical safety websites.

- ONLY use extension cords temporarily
- Make sure the extension cord is properly rated for its intended use and that it is certified by a nationally-recognized testing laboratory
- Inspect the extension cord for damage before using it and discard damaged cords
- NEVER use an extension cord that feels hot
- Do NOT run extension cords through walls or ceilings - cords may overheat
- Do NOT nail or staple electrical cords to walls or baseboards
- Make sure cords are not pinched in windows, doors, or under heavy **furniture**
- Keep extension cords out of high-traffic areas
- Insert plugs fully so that no part of the prong is exposed


