A. <u>Investment Approval</u> : Determine if recipient has been approved for investment of IHBG funds.				
B. <u>Audit Findings:</u> Are there any unresolved material financial audit findings or exceptions? If there are material financial audit findings or exceptions, recommend withdrawal of investment authority.		Most recent annual audit		
C. <u>Investment Policy:</u> Obtain and review the Investment Policy for compliance. (Recipient must have an investment policy.)		PIH Notice 2015-08

В.	Reconciliation: Verify that the investment account is being periodically reconciled to the general ledger.		PIH Notice 2015-08		
C.	Approved Instruments: Verify funds are invested only in approved investment instruments				
D.	<u>Co-Mingling:</u> Determine if IHBG funds are held in one or more accounts separate from other funds of the recipient. If not, a finding should result.		PIH Notice 2015-08		
E.	Maturity Schedule: A maturity schedule is required. Investments may be for a period no longer than 5 years. The 5-year period starts on the date the recipient draws down funds for investment purposes. The 5-year requirement is the maximum period of time that any amount drawn down for investment can be invested before disbursement on an affordable housing activity.		PIH Notice 2015-08		



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Verify that IHBG funds have not been invested for more than 5 years. If the IHBG funds have been invested more than 5 years, a finding with questioned costs should result, and interest earned on the investment must be returned to the Treasury and any principle must be returned to LOCCS.				
F. <u>Internal Controls:</u> Determine if internal controls are adequate.				
Compare policies to practices.				
Determine if there are safekeeping procedures covering security of investment documents.				
3. Determine if there is separation of responsibilities for custody of securities from maintenance of accounting record.				
4. Ensure that the investments are made only in the name of the IHBG recipient.				
5. Ensure that all interest earned is collected, recorded, and credited to appropriate accounts.				
G. Administrative Capacity: If the monitoring review discloses that the recipient does not have administrative capacity, request withdrawal of investment authority.
