Please recycle items that can be recycled. **Current recycling rules allow ONLY the following items in the recycling dumpster.**

- Brown corrugated cardboard - flattened
- Plastics #1 and #2 - BOTTLENECK only
No lids, yogurt, butter, cottage cheese, salad, etc. containers
- Magazines
- Newspapers - clean
- White copy paper - NO colored paper, junk mail, envelopes

- Metal cans - clean and rinsed (no food residue); no lids

Never Make a Late Payment Again

Set Up Online Bill Pay And Your Payments Are Automatic

Did you know that your bank may offer **FREE** online bill pay to help you pay your bills quickly, seamlessly, and on time?

Save gas, time, and postage by setting up online bill pay.

Set up your housing payment to be paid on the first of every month so that your payment is **never late**.

Rent and housing payments are due by the 5th of every month and late by the 6th of every month.

Late payments count against your holiday credit.

For more information, contact your bank or go online and check to see if your financial institution offers this service.

Per HB 3125, Oregon DMV Can Now List Emergency Contacts Under a new law, the Oregon DMV can register two emergency contacts so that first responders know who to call if something happens to you. Contacts can be a family member or friend; if under 18, a parent or legal guardian must be one of the contacts. Parents/guardians can register on a child's behalf. To register, go to DMV2U.Oregon.gov and sign in to "Access My DMV Profile". An Oregon driver's license, permit, or identification card is required to register.

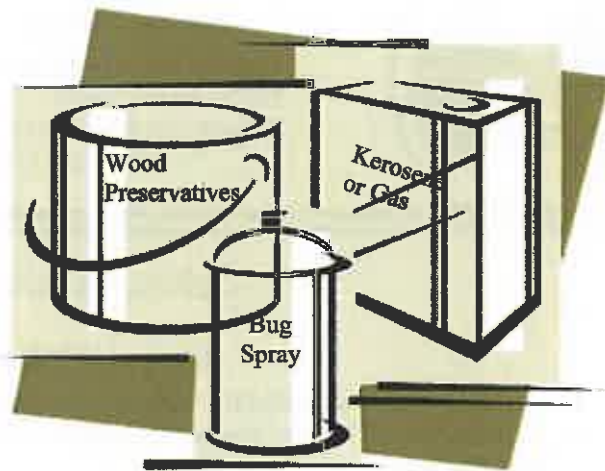

HOW TO BRING YOUR HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS TO THE EVENT:

Products should be left in their original container. Label materials not in their original container only if you are sure of the contents.

Please do not mix products together. Dangerous reactions can occur when some materials are mixed.

Make sure containers are properly sealed so they won't leak or spill. If a container is leaking, secure it in a secondary leak-proof container.

Transport in a sturdy box or tub in your trunk or truck bed.

Please do not put items in plastic bags.

Bring in any of the items listed and we will dispose of them for you in a manner friendly to the environment.

Metal Collection Event

Coos County has extended the time period for the metal collection event at the Beaver Hill Disposal Site. The time period has been extended to **September 30, 2022**. The fee for metal will be waived for this time period.

Examples of accepted items:

- ◆ washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, small metal appliances
- ◆ wood burning stoves
- ◆ empty burn barrels
- ◆ barbeques
- ◆ microwave ovens
- ◆ refrigerators/freezers – Coos County will remove freon and compressors
- ◆ small and large metal tools
- ◆ metal furniture
- ◆ bicycles
- ◆ exercise equipment (metal)
- ◆ tire rims
- ◆ lawn equipment (drained)
- ◆ empty propane tanks with valve/stem removed
- ◆ metal fencing with wood posts removed
- ◆ nails, screws, misc. (please place in metal container or tin cans)
- ◆ miscellaneous scrap metal

Not accepted: vehicles, logging and fishing cable, Household Hazardous Waste

If you have any questions, please call 541-396-7620. Please leave a short message and a phone number as booth attendant may be outside the booth with customers.

If you have household garbage, furniture, brush, tires, or construction debris that you are bringing to Beaver Hill, please remember those items will need to be separated. The fees for these items will not be waived during the metal collection event.
