
As a reminder, per CIHA's Common Scheme Restrictions, which apply to <u>ALL HOUSEHOLDS ON KILKICH</u>, there is no parking in your yard <u>AT ANY TIME</u>. All parking, other than in the driveway or garage, must be on the side of the street where the streetlights are and must not exceed 24 hours.

No unused vehicles of any kind shall be parked or repaired on the land, except in an enclosed garage or a paved or graveled area on the lot and adjacent to the unit. Vehicles must have current registration tags and must be moveable/operable - no flat tires. Repeated violations will affect your holiday credit.

EVER WONDER WHAT OUR TRIBAL POLICE DO WHEN NOT PROTECTING US HERE AT KILKICH?

Are the Coquille Indian Tribal Police Restricted to Working on the Reservation?

Tribal Police play a crucial role in maintaining law and order at Kilkich; however, their jurisdictional authority extends beyond the boundaries of the Reservation. Our police department primarily serves the Coquille Tribal Lands and is tasked with enforcing tribal laws and upholding the sovereignty of tribal governments, while addressing crime and ensuring the well-being of tribal members and Kilkich residents.

Do Coquille Tribal Police have the same authority as Coos Bay and North Bend Police Departments? For example, to make traffic stops and arrest people?

Absolutely, and unlike city police who cover their own areas, Coquille Tribal Police work with both Coos Bay and North Bend police departments, along with Coos County and State police agencies.

Do Coquille Tribal Police Investigate off Tribal Lands?

Yes. The Coquille Tribal Police department joins forces with outside agencies and is involved with the Major Crimes Team, the South Coast Interagency Narcotics Team (SCINT), Accident Investigation Team, the DUII Task Force and Emergency Response Team.

What is Community Policing?

Chief Merritt believes community policing is essential at Kilkich. Building trust and partnerships with community members is integral to the work of our Tribal Police department. By engaging with Kilkich residents and addressing their concerns, Coquille Tribal Police can enhance public safety and prevent crime.
