

Old Tower House & Captain's House (1872)

o 476 Newmark

o The home of Capt. Ed Scog, master bar and ocean pilot.

Major Morton Tower House (1869, 1892)

o 486 Schetter

Century House (1885)

o 317 N. Empire Blvd.

4 Century House (1901)

o 333 N. Empire Blvd.

Captain James Magee House (1873)

o 155 S. Mill

o Master bar and ocean pilot built this house for his new bride Sarah.

6 Century House (1886)

o 208 S. Empire Blvd.

Captain's House (1925)

o 288 S. Empire Blvd.

o Former home of Capt. Charlie Magee, son of Capt. James Magee.

Captain's House (1932)

o 395 S Empire Blvd.

o Capt. Floyd Brown lived here. He was captain of the Corps of Engineers ocean-going dredge Col. P.S. Michie. The ship kept Coos Bay bar and the lower bay channel deep enough for large vessels.

Century & Captain's House (1890)

o 435 S. Empire Blvd.

o Once home of Capt. Cecil Holland. He was skipper of the gas boat **Eagle**, which he built in 1903 at Marshfield (now Coos Bay)

Empire House (1924)

o 467 S Empire Blvd.

o Built of lumber lost from the wreck of steamer C.A. Smith.

Century & Captain's House (1901)

o 342 S Marple

o Here lived Capt. Dale Holden, pilot and captain of gas boats **Pilot**, **Tiger**, and others.
