Speeding tickets can range from \$115 to \$440, and failing to stop at a stop sign can cost \$265.

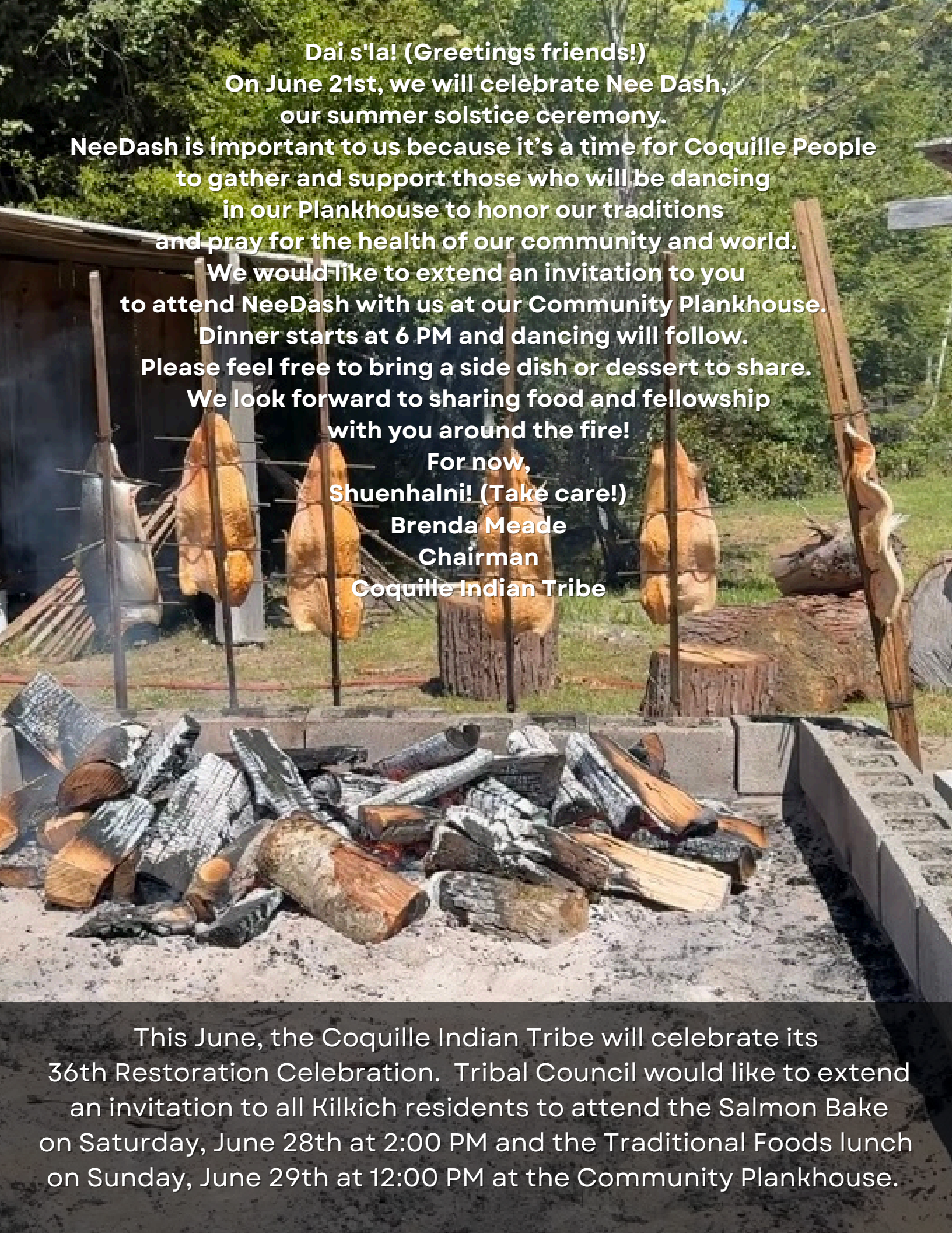


2025 Summer Food Service Program Kids Eat Free - Begins June 19th
