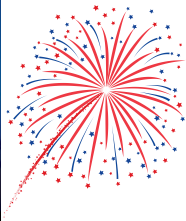

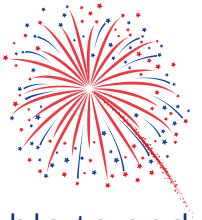

FIRE SEASON ALERT: NO BURNING OR FIREWORKS ALLOWED

SUMMER IS HERE, AND WE ARE IN THE MIDST OF FIRE SEASON.

WITH THE INCREASED RISK OF WILDFIRES, IT IS CRUCIAL FOR EVERYONE TO BE AWARE OF THE DANGERS AND TAKE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS TO PREVENT ANY FIRE-RELATED INCIDENTS.

ALL FORMS OF BURNING AND THE USE OF FIREWORKS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

FIREWORKS CAN EASILY IGNITE VEGETATION AND LEAD TO UNCONTROLLABLE FIRES, POSING A SERIOUS THREAT TO BOTH PEOPLE AND PROPERTY.

WE URGE EVERYONE TO EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION DURING THIS FIRE SEASON. BY ADHERING TO THESE RULES, WE CAN COLLECTIVELY REDUCE THE RISK OF WILDFIRES AND PROTECT OUR BEAUTIFUL SURROUNDINGS. REMEMBER, SAFETY COMES FIRST, AND IT IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY TO PREVENT ANY POTENTIAL DISASTERS.

STAY SAFE AND VIGILANT, AND LET'S WORK TOGETHER TO ENSURE A FIRE-FREE SEASON.



You might notice something new wandering around the tribal properties and wooded areas in the 5-county service area. Tribal Conservation Officer Collier has a new patrol vehicle which is outfitted with lights and new custom logos, which she designed.

This truck was purpose-built to serve as the primary mobile base for any and all emergency operations in the forest and for the Kilkich community, as needed.

The truck is outfitted with lights, sirens, radios, and antennae. But that is just the beginning. The truck also hosts an array of safety equipment to assist tribal members who may encounter an emergency.

There are also emergency supplies to aid Officer Collier in case of an emergency situation such as a landslide, which could strand her in a desolate forest, and enough medical and survival supplies to aid anyone she is sent to rescue.

As the only law enforcement officer versed in all CIT forest properties, Officer Collier is the first responder for most emergencies involving tribal members in the forest.

The truck was built to survive the most extreme conditions.

The truck is lifted for more ground clearance to assist in recovery efforts during possible floods, tsunamis, or freak snowstorms,

and has a Decked storage system where tools and supplies are stored.

Want to see inside the truck? Just catch Officer Collier while she is at the KAB, and she would love to give you a tour and show off how she can help save lives and protect our most valuable resources, our people.
